## **Baseball Math**

You can find math in the world all around you, including the baseball diamond. Below you will find some fun things to talk to your child about and games

to play while you're at a stadium or a little league game.

Shapes are an easy place to start. What shape is the field or the ball? How many sides are on the bases and home plate? Ask what other shapes they see? Play eye spy a shape.

Next you can practice counting. You can have them count the bases, the players, seats in your row, etc. Teach your little one *Take Me Out to the Ballgame* so they are ready for the 7th inning stretch and can practice counting to 3.

You can also work on number recognition. Ask what number the player at bat is or the number the 1st baseman has on his jersey. Then point to the score board and ask what numbers they see.

We hope that the next time you're at the ballpark you get a chance to try these with your child.
