Your Money Deserves a Raise

At MidWest America, we understand that money doesn't go as far as it used to — what you save needs to work as hard as it can. We truly appreciate the opportunity to serve you and want to give back whenever we can.

That's why we offer free and low-cost services to support your everyday banking. But we didn't want to stop there! Earlier this month, MidWest America increased the rate on our Reward Checking product from 1.25% APY to 4.00% APY on balances up to \$10,000 — putting more money back in your pocket.

This is one of the highest checking account dividends offered by financial institutions in the nation, which is great news if you already have a Reward Checking account. And if you don't yet, it's not too late to jump in and start earning more on your money!

It's time your money earned more — because it truly deserves a raise.

Each qualification cycle that the minimum requirements are met, 4.00% Annual Percentage Yield (APY) will be paid on balances between one penny and \$10,000, and 0.20% APY paid on all amounts above \$10,000. If you do not meet the requirements per cycle, your account will earn 0.01% APY; however, you will not receive ATM refunds. ATM fee refunds up to \$12 per cycle, if requirements are met. Dividend rate subject to change. No minimum balance required. Available on personal accounts only. No monthly service charge if all Reward Checking requirements are met. Accounts not meeting the monthly qualifications will be assessed a \$5.00 fee which could reduce earnings. *APY = Annual Percentage Yield.

Announcing the 89th Annual Meeting

MidWest America will hold its 89th Annual Meeting on **Saturday, March 28th at 10 a.m**. Pre-registration is required to attend this meeting and will begin in January. More information on how to pre-register will be provided in the next issue of the Hotline.

The Nominating Committee has proposed two candidates for 3-year terms of office: **Samuel Zook and Ted Storer.** The bio-information for the candidates is included on the following page.

Nominations for vacancies on the Board of Directors may also be made by a petition signed by one percent of the membership (510 signatures). The petition must state that it is for a 3-year term on the Board of Directors.

Each nominee, by petition, shall submit a statement of qualifications and biographical data limited to 100 words or less. Petitions must be accompanied by signed statements indicating that the candidate will serve if elected. The petition form must contain:

- · printed name;
- signed name & complete address.
